#### **ADVENT**

Last weekend we celebrated the First Sunday of Advent, and in doing so we move into a new liturgical year. We give thanks for the blessings of the year just gone and begin with the joy of waiting and preparing for the coming of the Christ child.

Advent is preparation time for the coming of Christ at Christmas, when we are invited to accept Christ, not only into the world, but into our personal lives. Too often our preparations are tied up with getting the decorations ready, the presents, the food, the family's social calendar. Now let's look at this in another way:

<u>Decorations</u> – Let us decorate ourselves with thoughts for those around us; what can I decorate another's life with? What colour and light can I bring to others?

<u>Presents</u> – Let us be present to those around us. Can we give someone the gift of our presence – some time doing something for them, or just taking time to talk rather than rushing off to buy something else?

<u>Food</u> – Have we prepared ourselves for the life-giving eternal food of receiving Christ in the Eucharist this Christmas? This food has the cheapest cost we will spend – but the greatest nourishment.

<u>Social Calendar</u> – In amongst the family dinners and parties have we set aside time to party with Christ? Will we be attending Mass each Sunday of Advent to get ready for Christmas?

#### **End of Year Reports**

Tomorrow your child will be bringing home their end of year report. In the envelope there is also a letter explaining the A-E grading system used in Years 1-6. Please take the time to read through the report with your child, discussing their successes and their goals for 2015.

**Year 5 parents** - You will need to keep these reports handy, as they are required for high school enrolments in 2015.

**Year 4 & 6 parents** - Included in the envelope is your child's *Religious Literacy Assessment* completed last term.

**Teacher Interviews** - Interviews are available for any parent who has concerns about any aspect of their child's report. Please make an appointment to see your child's class teacher.

#### **Road Safety Reminder**

We have a dedicated **drop off zone** before school in Troy Street.

The sign reads: No Parking - 8:00am-9:30am SCHOOL DAYS

It has been noted that parents are actually parking in this area and moving away from the car. A "No Parking" sign means you cannot park, but you can drop off or pick up passengers or goods without leaving your vehicle (i.e. you must be within three metres of your vehicle). You must attend to your business promptly (within two minutes of stopping your vehicle.) The fine for this offence is \$173 and loss of 2 demerit points.

**For the girls** - black tights will be worn with the winter tunic with no option of white socks. These changes will take effect in 2015.


#### **School Survey**

#### **Individual Numeracy Assessments 2015 for Year 1-6**

The first two days of school in 2015 will be **Staff Development Days** – Tuesday 27th and Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> January. Staff will be using these days to assess children using a one-on-one numeracy interview. Each test goes for a minimum of 30 minutes.

An on-line booking form will be available next week. Students will come to school for their allocated time. They can wear casual clothes. Those students who miss out will be able to complete the test with a teacher at a later date.

Thank you for helping our children to support the DWF Appeal.


We were able to raise just under \$600. This money will help support many organisations that help single mothers, those who are hearing impaired, catechists and people in need of counselling.

#### Jesse Tree

Jesse was the father of the great King David of the Old Testament. He is often looked upon as the first person in the genealogy of Jesus. The Jesse Tree is a leafless tree decorated with symbols portraying Jesus' spiritual heritage. It is like a family tree and comes from the Prophet Isaiah ch. 11 v 1: A shoot will spring forth from the stump of Jesse, and a branch out of his roots.

The Jesse Tree connects the Advent Season with the faithfulness of God across 4000 years of history. A branch is a biblical sign of hope from discouragement and is therefore a good symbol of Jesus Christ who is the revelation of God's grace and faithfulness.

The Jesse Tree and the people of our Christian tradition who waited patiently for the coming of the Saviour and were connected to Jesus in ancestry, have been the focus of our Year 6 students during their Advent unit.

They have read Scripture, made connections and created symbols of the many people who prepared the way for the coming of the Christ Child. Every morning the students have been sharing with the school community and it has been our prayer focus each day. Each day two new symbols are placed on the tree outside the print-room which can be seen from the Infants Playground.

Congratulations Year 6 and your teachers, for sharing your learning with us in such a rich and practical way.

#### Student Achievements

#### Changes to Parent Payments using credit cards with Scholastic Book Club next year.

As many large schools transition towards a cashless system for purchasing items from the Scholastic Book Club, there have been some significant changes made to the credit card payment system.



Starting next year, LOOP (Linked Online Ordering and Payment) will be available for parents to both o*rder and pay* for Book Club items in one transaction. This allows you to create one order for all your children attending Our Lady of the Way, from any or all brochures. There will be no need to return Book Club paperwork to the school if using this method; your order will simply be included with the rest of the school's order which will be submitted by the school book club volunteers and distributed on arrival at the school as per normal.
