We want to know more about how to help educate our children on keeping safe online.

The eSafety Commission has spent the last 18 months working alongside various experts to create, refresh and streamline eSafety's content. Every page on their site has been updated with tailored advice, resources and support to ensure it helps Australians have empowering and positive experiences online.

Almost a third of the website features exciting new material, including a section for young people, guided by young people. Not only is this a great resource for students, but the topics can help with online safety conversations in Australian classrooms and homes.

Over 300 of the site's resources, including our popular education resources, have been refreshed and re-branded and are easier to find using our new filter feature. Now, you can search by education level and topic to ensure you find what best resonates with your specific children's age and needs. There is also a whole section designed specifically for parents with information on a range of topics. The site has also had some of its older resources scrapped — with new research and technology, they have become outdated and are no longer relevant.

The new online safety hub presents an incredible opportunity to reach a broader range of Australians and make them aware of eSafety's resources and services.

## Plenary 2020

The parents and school staff of Our Lady of the Way Catholic School are encouraged and are most welcome to attend the **Blue Mountains Catholic Community Forum** as part of the **Plenary 2020** process.

This forum is **not** a repeat of the forums we had last year and early this year but this is a part of the second phase, the listening and discernment phase. We will be using a traditional decision making process in small groups and considering the most common responses that made up a large part of the 18,000 responses to the first phase. The object of this forum is to hand on our results to the Plenary Council. Participants will have some choice as to which themes they can reflect upon. The Plenary Council has divided the findings into six overarching themes.

Missionary and Evangelising Inclusive Participatory and Synodal Prayerful and Eucharistic Humble Healing and Merciful A joyful, hope-filled Servant Community Open to Conversion, Renewal and Reform

## **Strings Program**

## Creative Kids Vouchers:

A number of parents have inquired about paying for the Strings Program with the Creative Kids Vouchers, please note that this is not a possibility as stated on the NSW Government website: All activities are to be delivered outside of the school curriculum. NSW public, private and Catholic schools are ineligible providers. Providers must apply and be approved by Service NSW to be registered with Creative Kids.

### Student Travel for 2020

Applications for student travel in 2020 opened on Friday, 11th October 2019.

Students progressing to year 3 and year 7 no longer need to re-apply if they:

- are continuing at the same school
- are residing at the same address
- have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to <u>https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails</u>

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2019 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2019, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2020.

#### **OPAL CARDS**

One of the more significant changes created by the recent introduction of the Student Opal Card is the requirement for students to 'tap on' and 'tap off' when travelling to and from school on any school bus boarded in the course of their journey.

Opal data gathered by 'tap on' and 'tap off' is used to determine the demand for bus services. If students do not 'tap on' and 'tap off', lack of perceived patronage could lead to a review of the level of services provided to your school.

With this in mind, we seek your assistance in reminding your children that tapping on and tapping off correctly is one of the conditions of using the Student Opal Card.

Host One of Our Visiting Sasebo Junior High School Japanese Students 13 - 15 years of age and they speak some English.



The Japanese students will arrive Thursday 26th March 2020 and will be at OLOW for 3 weekdays, Friday, Monday and Tuesday having English lessons in the morning, and participating in classes with the OLOW students in the afternoon. The students will spend the weekend with their host families enjoying family life.

Responsibilities as a host family would be to provide a comfortable bed, meals, lifts to and from school, and a friendly welcoming family environment. Host families are paid \$50 per night.

If you would be interested, we need to pass your contact details on to Mr Takashi Ushinohama from VS Oceania. This is the company organising the exchange for our Japanese visitors. Notes will be coming home in the coming week with your children, so if you would be interested in being a host family, please complete the form attached to that note, and return it with your child either to Mrs Schafer or the office.

All school notes and newsletters are updated onto this site and you will receive an alert when something is uploaded or there is an important or urgent announcement.

## LEAVING OLOW AT THE END OF 2019?

A reminder to families that a terms notice (10 school weeks) in writing MUST be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during the term for the next term and where appropriate notice has been received, a pro-rata credit will be calculated. Where a term's notice has not been given to the principal, the term's school fees will be charged for your children. This is a Diocesan Policy.

## CHANGE OF NAME MCCARTHY CATHOLIC COLLEGE TO PENOLA CATHOLIC COLLEGE AS OF 2020

From the beginning of the 2020 new school year, McCarthy Catholic College will be known as Penola Catholic College Emu Plains. This transition is due to McCarthy Catholic Trade Training Centre becoming part of the CathWest Innovation College from 2020, which will have a campus at McCarthy Emu Plains and Loyola, Mt Druitt. The College community welcomes this news as a significant step celebrating Australia's first saint starting a school in Penola to enable education to be accessed by children and adults.

Penola Catholic College will continue to serve students from Year 7 to Year 12. Penola Catholic College name recognises the strength that this proud learning community draws from values and example of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop.

The history of the College and the McCarthy name will continue to be recognised and acknowledged in a variety of ways at Penola Catholic College, as well as at the McCarthy campus of CathWest Innovation College.
