# Principal's Message

Shortly you will receive your child's Semester Two report. With this in mind, it is timely to share some information regarding how students at Our Lady of the way are assessed.

## **ASSESSMENT FOR SUCCESS**

As educators, we assess our students in a variety of ways. The following are ways in which we use formative assessment to know where our students are and where they need to be.

## **INVOLVE LEARNERS IN THE PROCESS**

We:

- ✓ ask them to name their learning goal and tell us how they know they have met it.
- ✓ help students form habits in documenting their work, and then teach them how to self-assess.
- ✓ invite students to plot their own data, investigate the findings, and speculate the ways that will promote further successful learning.
- ✓ require students to reflect before, during, and after learning.

## **BY BECOMING VISIBLE LEARNERS**

We:

- ✓ define the learning intentions.
- ✓ determine where learners will attend to the target (success criteria) most explicitly during the learning experience.
- ✓ consider how students might make the learning relevant to this target visible and invite them to do so.
- ✓ document this learning using print, audio, and visual recordings.
- $\checkmark\,$  study the data gathered, looking for patterns for future success.
- ✓ use the ideas that emerge to inform our feedback, our own learning, and theirs as well.



When we are able to assess without disrupting learning and when the learners themselves are part of every phase of the assessment process, the results can be truly amazing.

Please note that OLOW is moving towards being a cashless school from 2021. More information will be provided as we move closer to this transition.

### Ice block days

As part of Year 6 Fundraising for 2020, we will be introducing an Ice Block Punch Card system starting on Wednesday 18 November.

Zooper Doopers will be available at 2nd Break on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. Ice Block punch cards can be purchased for \$5. A group of Year 6 students will be running the ice block days.



If you would like to purchase a \$5 card, please complete the form that was sent home last week with your child's name, class and payment details and return it to the school office.

This card will entitle your child to 10 ice blocks in Term 4. The card will be kept within the school so that it is not accidentally left at home on ice block day. Each time your child buys an ice block we will punch a hole in their card.

Please note:

- No child will be allowed to purchase more than 2 ice blocks per day, however, if you would like to limit your child to 1 ice block please indicate that on the form below and we will mark it on their punch card.
- The ice block sales are a cashless system. Students will need a punch card to make their purchase and will not be able to pay with cash on the day.

# 2021 School Travel Applications Are Now Open

Applications for student travel in 2021 are now open.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now <u>apply</u> online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should <u>re-apply or update their details</u>.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new <u>eligibility criteria</u>, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

<u>Term Bus Pass</u> holders will receive a notification to re-apply. Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2020.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021.

# Kindergarten enrolments for 2020

Offers of enrolment for Kindergarten 2020 have been sent out and we are in the process of finalising numbers. Ensure your child's place at Our Lady of the Way by completing and returning your enrolment forms as soon as possible. Once complete, please submit your application to the School Office. Enrolment packs can be collected from the school office or downloaded from our website at <u>http://www.olowemuplains.catholic.edu.au</u>.

There are limited places available in other grades. If you are aware of families wishing to enrol their children, please ask them to contact the school office on 4777 7200.

### LEAVING OLOW AT THE END OF 2020?

A reminder to families that a term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing MUST be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during the term for the next term and where appropriate notice has been received, a pro-rata credit will be calculated. Where a term's notice has not been given to the principal, the term's school fees will be charged for your children. This is a Diocesan Policy.

The children will be divided into groups mixed across all the grades and will enjoy such activities as stocking sewing, Christmas craft, cake and biscuit decorating and much, much more.
