Principal's Message



Dear Our Lady of the Way Community

Last Saturday we had the absolute pleasure of witnessing our students receiving their First Holy Communion. Thank you to all the parents and Parish Sacramental Committee members who prepared these children for this Sacrament.

During the homily, Fr Michael made reference to a public address given by Pope Francis. The Holy Father Pope informed the audience that 70 years ago to the day, he celebrated his first Communion. He went on to say, "They say that you shouldn't talk about personal things, but I can't resist the temptation". He then went on to say "Today I am so thankful to the Lord because 70 years ago I made my first Communion," he said with a broad smile. "Let us all thank the Lord for our baptism, all of us thank him for our first Communion," he said. The 77-year-old pope revealed the personal tidbit to underline what it means to enter into communion with the Catholic Church and to seek communion with Christians who belong to other confessions or traditions.



Fr Michael encouraged us all to ensure that our children have regular opportunities to attend mass and receive communion.

LEARNING NEWS

PBS4L - Positive Behaviour Support 4 Learning.

As shared in the previous newsletter, we are on a continual journey in developing our understanding, learning and skills in many areas. This week we are sharing the last of our 'scripts' or expectations for various parts of our day. The purpose of the scripts is to explicitly unpack teacher and student actions and responsibilities particularly when there is a need for safe practices. The focus of the scripts in this newsletter include Japanese and Music Changeover, Sensory Garden, Playground and Playtime. We hope this helps you understand and support our practice at OLOW.





Japanese and Music Changeover Procedure



Name of procedure: RFF Changeover

REASON for this procedure? Orderly exchange of classes

WHAT are the steps for successful completion of the procedure?

Teacher Actions/Responsibilities	Student Actions/Responsibilities
 Teachers pack up students 5 mins before leaving the classroom. Ensure students are lined up quietly in two lines and with necessary equipment eg headphones in bag & instruments - strings for Music. Teacher to ensure students cross the playground in an orderly fashion to the meeting point. Teachers lead students from classrooms at 9:50 & 12:25 to meet under the COLA except for Yrs 3 & 4. Years 3 and 4 meet under the covered area on the brown playground. Crunch & Sip will take place in Japanese classes & not in Music classes due to instrument care. Kinder Dismissal - Wed & Thurs afternoon -TA will collect After School Care Students from Music at 2:45 pm Music Class follows shortly after to be ready for pick up at 2:55 from the playground outside of Kindergarten. Japanese teacher will line up After School Care Students and send children to get their bags. Japanese class follows shortly after for 2:55 pick up from the playground. 	 Students will follow teacher instructions for the pack up routine quietly and quickly ensuring nothing is left behind. Students will bring necessary equipment eg. headphones, instruments -strings with them to the classroom. Students will carry equipment safely. Walking in a quiet and orderly fashion to the meeting point.
 WET WEATHER ALTERATIONS Use undercover walkways. 	 WET WEATHER ALTERATIONS Students will walk in two lines using the undercover walkways. Students will leave the Music classroom early to get prepared for pick up.

WHO needs to be taught this procedure? All students.

WHO will teach this procedure? Japanese and Music Teachers.

WHEN is this procedure needed? Tuesday Wednesday Thursday,

WHEN will the procedure be taught? In context e.g. during RFF lessons.

WHEN will the procedure be practised? Individual teachers practise with their classes.

HOW will you recognise procedure compliance? Teachers to acknowledge and report on success through observation and the data on the PBS4L spreadsheet.

HOW will you consistently enforce and correct errors? All staff to precorrect with verbal prompts during changeover time. Teachers will prompt, praise and correct behaviours using Free and Frequent feedback.



Sensory Garden Playground



Name of procedure: Sensory Garden

REASON for this procedure?

Smooth procedure transition into and from the Sensory Garden WHAT are the steps for successful completion of the procedure?

Teacher Actions/Responsibilities Student Actions/Responsibilities

Teacher Actions/Responsibilities	Student Actions/Responsibilities
 Wear a high vis vest, hat and carry the duty bag Meet the K/1 students at the gate. Some students from other grades may also play in the area - as negotiated by the grade teachers. Teachers actively move around the area to observe and monitor play. If help is required there are laminated cards in the cupboard that can be sent to the office and someone will respond to this. One teacher is to open the gate for children coming in and out to monitor the number of students using the area. Supervise children playing in the swing - consider a time limit per turn. Remind students to keep their socks in their shoes when removing these for play in the sandpit. 5 minutes before the bell teacher to ask all students to pack up. Invite students with their shoes and socks. Line students up at the gate and remind them to go to the toilet and wash their hands. 	 Year 6 students will uncover the sandpit at the start of the day. Students will line up outside the gate and wait to be let in by the teacher on duty. Students take off their shoes and socks to play in the sandpit. Students sit on the sandstone wall to wait for a turn on the swing. Students take turns with equipment, including the swing. Students listen to the teacher's instructions for packing up. Students line up in two lines at the end of play and listen to the teacher. Students leave the area and go to the toilet and wash their hands before the bell. At the end of 2nd break the Year 6 Leaders will come to cover the sandpit.
 WET WEATHER ALTERATIONS Sensory Garden will be closed as students will remain in the classroom for break time. 	 WET WEATHER ALTERATIONS Sensory Garden closed.

WHO needs to be taught this procedure? All students accessing the Sensory garden. WHO will teach this procedure? K/1 teachers and teachers that have duty in this area. WHEN is this procedure needed? Daily

WHEN will the procedure be taught? Term 1 Role play before and during play time to reinforce. WHEN will the procedure be practised? Individual teachers practise with their classes.

HOW will you recognise procedure compliance? Teachers to acknowledge and report on success. HOW will you consistently enforce and correct errors? Feedback & tokens.



Play time Procedure



Name of procedure: Playtime REASON for this procedure? Safety of students WHAT are the steps for successful completion of the procedure?

WHAT are the steps for successful completion of the procedure?	
Teacher Actions/Responsibilities	Student Actions/Responsibilities
 Wear a high vis vest, hat and carry the duty bag. Be prompt to duty. Classroom teachers are to ensure students are seated until they are dismissed by a teacher on the microphone. Teacher on duty asks the children to pack the food/lunchbox away. One teacher on duty to dismiss students to particular playing areas. Main Playground Facilitate the socialisation of lonely children Ensure children are not acting in an anti-social way Be alert and move around the playground constantly in designated areas Ensure the playground is kept clean Address all dangers in the playground or area of duty. Remind students to walk on the concrete. When the music starts the teacher uses microphone to ask students to stop games, pack away equipment, go to the toilet, etc Znd Break - SRC to assist with pack up (roster) 	 Students remain seated during both eating times. Main Playground Students can play ball games on the astro turf. Students keep the ball below shoulder height. Students are mindful of other students in their play area. Students can play handball. Students can play with equipment in any area. Students walk on the concrete.
 Back Playground Students meet back playground teachers between the garden and Year 4 classroom when asked to move by the teacher on the microphone. Reinforce agreements, check where students are playing before proceeding to the back playground. Roam and observe play closely. Siren to go two minutes before the music begins and students line up at the gate. Reinforce expected behaviours and give some tokens. 	 Back Playground Each grade has an area they can play in. Students are inclusive and follow game rules. All games are non-contact. During ball games, students keep the ball below shoulder height. Students are mindful of other students in their play area. Students listen for teacher instructions.
 Year 2 Play Area Monitor High Needs Students and facilitate successful play. Monitor use of equipment and safety. 	 Year 2 Play Area Play safely with the equipment. Students can play handball but no other ball games.


