At the end of this week, we will take a well-earned break for a fortnight's holiday, returning to Learning from Home on Tuesday 5th October. Although it is unlikely that we will be able to take a trip away from our homes, it is still important that our families can refresh and recharge ready for Term 4. You may choose to change the routines of the last ten weeks. It might be a time when you may reduce screen time. We hope that family time can be seen as the big winner with this lockdown.

NAPLAN

NAPLAN results for 2021 have been released this week and are available at the front office if your child was involved in this assessment. We have only had the opportunity to have a quick analysis of the results and we are extremely pleased with the performance of our students, particularly in the area of reading, which has been a major focus over the last two years.

ROAD MAP TO RETURNING TO SCHOOL

Staggered return

Priority cohorts will begin face-to-face learning on Monday, 25 October 2021, as long as community transmission and vaccination rate requirements have been met.

The start of the staggered return of students to face-to-face learning depends upon at least 70 percent of the state's eligible adult population being vaccinated. Current NSW Health projections indicate this will be before mid-October – which is why NSW Health and Education have confidence in the start date for the staged return being 25 October.





Roadmap to return to face-to-face learning (Updated 12:30 pm 27 August 2021) from:

- 25 October Kindergarten and Year 1
- from 1 November Years 2, 6 and 11
- from 8 November Years 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 9 and 10.

Students in Year 12 and those completing their HSC are already able to return in a limited way and this will continue for the remainder of Term 3. From 25 October, these students will have full-time access to school campuses and their teachers.

Low community transmission in LGA*

Students can only return to face-to-face learning in LGAs where community transmission cases are 50 or less per 100,000 people, based on health advice. For most LGAs in NSW this is already occurring. If cases exceed 50 per 100,000 in any LGA, learning from home will resume for that LGA until case numbers drop. This means about 64% of students in Greater Sydney wouldn't be able to return to school, totalling 554,861 students.

*The NSW Government has advised that this is subject to possible change. We will keep you updated on the plan as we approach the return date. If you have any concerns, please feel free to contact the school at any time.

Thank you again for all that you are doing during this challenging time.


