Student Validation

On Monday 16 August you would have received an email or SMS (for those parents without email) from Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) asking you to review and, where necessary, update the key information they hold about your children currently enrolled in CEDP schools.

The purpose of this review is to ensure that CEDP has the right details to correctly identify and support students, including contacting families in an emergency or to share important updates.

Steps have been taken to ensure this process is as secure as possible to protect your information and your family's privacy. Your information is only accessed by authorised staff when it is necessary and in accordance with our <u>Privacy Policy</u>.

The link is **open until Friday 3 September** and I encourage you to complete the review/update as soon as possible to ensure that your family's correct details are on file. This is particularly important as Greater Sydney remains in lockdown due to the COVID-19 outbreak.

Only one person per family needs to complete the survey and it takes about 15 minutes to complete. If you have any questions or to seek help, please contact the CEDP Community Liaison Team on 9840 5796.



Attendance

Each week a MANDATORY ATTENDANCE google form is sent out to families via Compass, Skoolbag, Facebook and will now be added to the Flexible Learning Hub page under the Attendance tab. We ask that you complete a form per child (please put the student's name in, not the parent's) to inform the school if students will be learning at home or at school. This supports us with our planning around staffing as we are following COVID-19 protocols to minimise staff on-site but want to ensure adequate staff for families who need to send their children to school.

This often requires participants to have a growth mindset and to be prepared to make mistakes in order to learn. This also requires persistence and reflection in order to make connections within and between concepts.



Book Week

Since 1945 the Children's Book Council of Australia (CBCA) has grown from a small Sydney-based group to a national organisation which exerts a profound influence on children's books. The annual CBCA Book of the Year Awards will be shared with the students via online learning. We have already read/shared most of the books with the students during their library visits in terms 1 and 2.

To fit in with the theme Old Worlds, New Worlds, OTHER WORLDS, lockdown is a perfect time to bring back the old favourite past-time of storytelling. At the end of the day, cuddle up with your kids and tell them stories. These could be any stories - stories of you as a child, stories about their grandparents, it's priceless for children to hear these stories because it connects them to Old Worlds, New Worlds, OTHER WORLDS. The best part of storytelling is that you can be as silly as you like and exaggerate to your heart's content because that just makes the story better and brings it to life. Some days you might like to ask the children to tell you a story.
