Principal's Message



Dear Our Lady of the Way Community

Last week was an exciting time for our Kinder to Year 4 students. They thoroughly enjoyed their swimming lessons and we had quite a few students who were exhausted when they returned to school. We received wonderful feedback from the venue who communicated with us that they thought the students from OLOW were the most well-behaved students and the staff were the most attentive that they had at the pool. Congratulations!

We had our Kindergarten 2023 students and their families attend an Orientation on 31 October. The current Kindergarten students assisted our new students to transition into the classroom. The parents had the opportunity to experience what a Religion, English and Mathematics lesson looks like.

Our students have also had opportunities to attend a number of sporting Gala Days. These are great opportunities provided by the Diocese of Parramatta. We thank the parents and staff members for volunteering to train our students and manage the teams on the day.

We are in the final stages of working out staffing for 2023. As soon as this is completed, we will communicate with parents and students. There will be an opportunity for the students to meet their new teachers before the end of the year.

Mr Crawford, Mrs Day and I had the opportunity to attend the CEDP System Leaders' and Clergy Symposium on 3 and 4 November. We had the absolute pleasure to listen to the Most Reverend Vincent Long OFM lead a Keynote. We also had the opportunity to listen to presentations from international presenters. The theme of the conference was What does "Catholic education for all" look like in the 21st Century in the Diocese of Parramatta?

Bishop Vincent presented us with a challenge. He reminded us that:

"In a society that increasingly sees education as a commodity that can be bought, we must resist being used as vehicles for socio-differentiation and elitism. Catholic schools find their authenticity in the Gospel priorities of respect for human dignity, outreach, inclusion and special concern for young people at risk of being left behind. Ours are not schools that provide education for Catholics only but Catholic education for all'
