Principal's Message



Dear Our Lady of the Way Community

I would just like to take this opportunity to thank all the community members for your support over the last week. It is so exciting to see the children returning to school and to see the sun. I ask that you keep all those in our community who are in isolation due to the flood in your prayers.

Over the last couple of weeks we have had an opportunity to hear from our families at our "Listening Conferences". We will be also hosting a collaborative meeting with families of children who have Personalised Plans before the end of this term.

In addition to this opportunity, we have sent home our first round of work samples. The Key Learning Area that was highlighted in this round was Religious Education. Our intention is that this has been an opportunity for you to talk to your child about their learning. The next work sample that will be sent home is Mathematics.

As a school last week we gathered as a community for Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday is one of the most popular and important holy days in the liturgical calendar. Ash Wednesday opens Lent, a season of fasting and prayer.

Ash Wednesday takes place 46 days before Easter Sunday, and is chiefly observed by Catholics, although many other Christians observe it too.



Ash Wednesday comes from the ancient Jewish tradition of penance and fasting. The practice includes the wearing of ashes on the head. The ashes symbolise the dust from which God made us. As the priest applies the ashes to a person's forehead, he says: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Alternatively, the priest may speak the words, "Repent and believe in the Gospel."

Ashes also symbolise grief, in this case, grief that we have sinned and caused division from God. Writings from the Second-century Church refer to the wearing of ashes as a sign of penance.

Priests administer ashes during Mass and all are invited to accept the ashes as a visible symbol of penance. Even non-Christians are welcome to receive the ashes. The ashes are made from blessed palm branches, taken from the previous year's Palm Sunday Mass.





#### Consent


If you wish to change consent for the use of students' image and/or works, please notify the school in writing or request a new consent form.
