### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

### **COMMUNITY EVENTS**

In the last few weeks we have celebrated Father's Day and Book Week. These are important celebrations where we come together as a community.

I want to thank all our community members who have attended the events. It's a great opportunity for family members to see our great school. I know the students love seeing their family in the school grounds.

A special mention to the huge effort made to ensure students were dressed up for our Book Week Parade. The students looked amazing and had a great time demonstrating their love of books.

Thank you to our Parents and Friends Association who ran the Father's Day stall. This was organised and run by parent volunteers. On behalf of all dads, I thank all our volunteers for the gift of their time!

### **NATIONAL CHILD PROTECTION WEEK**

This week is National Child Protection Week. The aim of the week is to promote a safe and supported life for every child, now and into the future.

All students will be participating in a range of activities that promote safety.

All students from years 3 to 6 will take part in the eSafety Commissioner's virtual classroom event; Be an eSafe Kid; Protect yourself - a live virtual classroom webinar that helps students to identify ways to protect themselves online and what to do if things go wrong. By the end of the learning session students will be able to:

- identify ways to use device settings to protect personal information that identifies them and prevent unwanted contact
- discuss the benefits of an eSafety family tech agreement
- develop help-seeking and reporting strategies

All students from K-6 will participate in webinars presented by the Daniel Morcombe Foundation. Presentations are tailored to infants and primary age students. The foundation's core message is focused on consent, specifically how to seek, give and deny permission. These are important skills for children to have that will help to keep them safe in the broader community.



### **SCHOOL UNIFORM**

Circle of security parenting helps parents develop secure relationships and stronger bonds with their children. The Circle of security course helps parents and carers of children aged 0-12 years learn:

- How to help your child feel more confident and secure

- Maintaining resilience long term
- Simple Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT) strategies

## <u>Turning into teens parenting program (6 week parenting program, online via zoom in the evening, free to register): Tuning into Teens Parenting Program T4 2023</u>

Turning into teens program supports you to help your adolescent emotional intelligence.

The goal of the program is to help parents teach and support your teenagers to understand and express emotions in appropriate ways.

Tuning in to Teens is aimed at parents with teenagers and has a focus on emotion coaching and building closer parent/child relationships.

### The program will cover:

- Foundations of emotion coaching
- Connecting and emotional acceptance
- Building intimacy and showing empathy
- Dealing with teen worry, sadness and anger
- Emotion coaching now and in the future
- How to help your teenagers understand and regulate their emotions
- How to develop a closer relationship with your adolescent children

The students are currently working on creating a brochure outlining significant places to visit in our local area.




### **English**


This term, we have been reading the wonderful books, 'Fire', 'Drought' and 'Flood' by Jackie French as part of our Shared Reading program each day. The students engaged with the books and have learnt to use a variety of strategies to infer the meaning of words and information when reading. Another focus was to observe the many literary devices authors use to engage a reader.

The students wrote excellent Haiku poems. Haiku poems are a traditional form of Japanese poetry made up of 3 lines. The first line has 5 syllables, second line has 7 syllables and the third line has 5 syllables. The students wrote very descriptive Haiku poems based on the books 'Fire', 'Drought' and 'Flood' or an Australian landmark.




















### Poetry Battle

To introduce the children to many different types of poetry, we decided to do a poetry battle each day. The students would listen to 2 poems and they would decide on one to be the winner of that battle. The winning poem continued on to another round until it came down to the last two, and finally a winner would be determined.







Earlier this term the pencils decided to go on strike! The Year 2 students received a letter from 'L Pencil', who explained that most of the pencils had gone on strike due to not being treated properly by their owners. The students had to write a very persuasive letter apologising and convincing their pencils to return so they could

once again help them with their learning. The students promised to look after their pencils by treating them with respect and returning them to their homes after each use.






### **Mathematics**


The students have continued to challenge themselves when problem solving in Maths each day.


Some of the topics they have investigated this term are: Time, Position, Multiplication /Division and Addition/ Subtraction.


The students are given a problem and then take some time to devise a strategy to solve it. They are encouraged to explain their thinking using mathematical language and solve the problem in different ways. The students enjoy sharing their explanations and strategies with each other. Many of the problems we explore in class are shared on Google Classroom.
















### **Sport**

Thanks to the success of the Matildas and the FIFA Women's World Cup the students were very enthusiastic during sport lessons which were organised and run by the Mini Roos.





















### Health

The focus in Health this term has been building positive relationships and exploring the question - 'How do we make our school a safe and respectful place for all?' The students have been looking at a variety of scenarios that can occur on the playground and working on strategies to help them resolve issues.

We have discussed the meaning of words such as community, inclusive and belonging. The students wrote a statement - 'Year 2 is an inclusive community where everyone is valued.' 


