PRINCIPAL

This week Year 6 went on their overnight camp to Canberra. I was fortunate enough to attend the camp. It was the first time in several years that I have attended a camp and it's fair to say I had forgotten about the lack of sleep and the constant nature of a school camp. The year 6 teachers, Mrs Bunter and Mr Jenkins supported by Mrs Dawes (Teacher's Aid) did a fantastic job both preparing the students and supporting them whilst on camp.

From my perspective it was a great two days where the students got to experience some of Canberra's facilities including Questacon, the Electoral Commission, The War Memorial, Australian Institute of Sport and of course, Parliament House. We were also lucky enough to have Melissa McIntosh, our local Federal Member of Parliament, take the time to speak to our students.

Our students always represented our Lady of the Way in a positive way. They were respectful of all adults including venue, accommodation, and school staff. Camp can be difficult for some students as they embark on a new experience away from their families, but our students rose to this challenge!

I want to thank our staff who went to camp, Mrs Bunter, Mr Jenkins and Mrs Dawes. The staff do this as they know how important it is to the students. They don't receive additional remuneration for going on camp and miss out on time with family and friends.

Outside Services in School

Many students access external service providers outside of school. These include and are not limited to, speech therapists, behaviour therapists, counsellors, occupational therapists, and psychologists. Such providers support children in important ways as they develop strategies to overcome challenges. These services are an important element of a student's overall support.

At school we will engage with such service providers via a phone call or meeting. We are happy to engage with service providers to achieve the best outcomes for students. There are limits on our ability to engage outside service providers and one of the biggest is the ability for providers to enter the school to either observe students or provide therapy. According to Catholic Schools Diocese of Parramatta (CSPD) such engagement is a breach of policy.

We have many system provided services available to staff to support students and will engage these when required.

Early Years Assessment

All students from kindergarten to year 2 are currently undertaking aspects of the Early Years Literacy Assessment (EYA). This assessment is standardised and all students in the Parramatta Diocese complete it. The assessment will help to inform instructional strategies used to ensure all students continue to make literacy progress, particularly in the area of reading.

The Second Sunday of Lent and the Transfiguration of the Lord.

Dear friends in Christ,

Not long after my Installation as your pastor, I desired to hold a Diocesan Synod in order to develop a pastoral plan which would follow my predecessor's "Faith in Our Future" and chart a new pathway for the Diocese. However, we had to wait for the long-delayed national Plenary Council to conclude.

Today, after much prayer and consultation, I formally announce the convocation of the Synod in the Diocese of Parramatta. This will be the first Synod in the history of our young Diocese. Like the national and universal synods, ours will be also held in two phases. The first assembly will be held from Thursday 12 to Sunday 15 October 2023 and the final assembly will be held near the middle of next year 2024.

Recognising the fruits of the Plenary Council and in the spirit of synodality, to which you have already contributed so deeply, I invite you to walk with me as we discern further a framework by which we can revitalise our Church in the Diocese and discover together a path of renewal for all of

I have appointed a Preparatory Commission to lead this process, chaired by Sr Ailsa Mackinnon RSM, Chancellor of Ministries and Qwayne Guevara as the Lead Facilitator.

Pope Francis has called the entire People of God into a journey of listening and discernment, inviting the Holy Spirit to guide us towards personal conversion and renewal in the Church. Pope Francis explains that 'The journey of synodality is the journey that God wants from His church in the third millennium'.

In preparation towards the Synod, I encourage you to participate in prayer, listening, discernment and local action, guided by the Holy Spirit, as we seek to witness to the Gospel and foster a more welcoming, compassionate, and humble Church. The Diocesan Synod will have a significant impact on the way in which we live out community and mission.

The time is now, here in the Diocese of Parramatta, for us to 'go out into the deep' (Luke 5:4) and step into the future that awaits us - one that is inspired by the deep understanding that God's love is not reserved for a few, but for all. Let us accompany one another along this path with firm hope and abiding trust in our God who desires our good, and who dwells among us.
